Call for 2023 CSCE Awards Nominations

The awards are the highest distinctions made by CSCE and are awarded to deserving members of the society. All nominations are strictly confidential. Nominees cannot self-nominate or be advised of their nomination until after the final selections are made. Prior knowledge by the nominee will disqualify candidates.

CSCE Fellowship

Eligibility criteria:

- A nominee must have a minimum of **10 years of professional experience** and shall be a member of CSCE [Life Member (LMCSCE), Member (MCSCE), Associate Member (ASCSCE)].
- Be in good standing with a minimum of 5 consecutive years of paid membership as of the nomination closing date.
- In addition, in all but exceptional circumstances, the nominee will be at least 45 years old.

A complete nomination requires three sponsors who are CSCE members in good standing, at least one of whom is a Fellow in good standing of the Society, separate attached letters of reference from two of the sponsors as well as a resume (5 page limit). Please submit the completed application form(s) and letters electronically by November 15, to awards@csce.ca.

A.B. SANDERSON AWARD

Recognizes outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to the development and practice of structural engineering in Canada. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

ALBERT E. BERRY MEDAL

Recognizes significant contributions by a civil engineer to the field of environmental engineering in Canada. Terms of Reference

CAMILLE A. DAGENAIS AWARD

Recognizes outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to the development and practice of hydrotechnical engineering in Canada. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

E. WHITMAN WRIGHT AWARD

Recognizes significant contributions by a civil engineer to the development of computer applications in civil engineering in Canada. <u>Terms of Reference, Submission Form</u>

HORST LIEPHOLZ MEDAL

Recognizes outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to engineering mechanics research and/or practice in Canada. Terms of Reference

SANDFORD FLEMING AWARD

Recognizes outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to transportation engineering research and/or practice in Canada. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

WALTER SHANLY AWARD

Recognizes outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to the development and practice of construction engineering in Canada. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

W. GORDON PLEWES AWARD

Recognizes particularly noteworthy contributions by an individual to the study and understanding of the history of civil engineering in Canada, or civil engineering achievements by Canadian engineers elsewhere. Normally, the recipient will be an individual, not necessarily an engineer, but in special circumstances the award can be given to an organization. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

PETER WRIGHT MEDAL

Recognizes long-standing supporters of the CSCE who have, over the course of decades, provided exceptional service and support to the Society. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

RALPH HAAS AWARD

Recognizes truly outstanding contributions by a civil engineer to sustainable infrastructure practice and/or research in Canada in any of the following areas: construction, transportation, sustainable development, asset management and pavement management. <u>Terms of Reference</u>

Organizational Awards – Regional and National Nominations

Organizational awards are identified at the regional level where they are reviewed and a top candidate is selected for the honour. Regional award winners are advanced to the national level for the review and selection process. The two-step selection process is intended to identify leaders within the regions that are deserving of recognition.

Nominations are invited at any time during the year for the three awards listed below. The completed nomination packages for the regional candidates must be received by **January 15.** Please submit nominations and supporting material **electronically**, clearly stating the award and the region for which the nomination is made by e-mail to awards@csce.ca.

EXCELLENCE IN INNOVATION IN CIVIL ENGINEERING AWARD

Recognizes excellence in innovation in civil engineering by an individual or a group of individuals practicing civil engineering in Canada, by a Canadian engineering firm, or by a Canadian research organization.

AWARD FOR GOVERNMENTAL LEADERSHIP IN SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

Recognizes those in the public sector who, through a project or program, are building for the future. Any municipal government or provincial or federal department or publicly controlled or owned utility that is planning, designing, building or delivering an infrastructure program or a project that significantly extends the life of these critical assets, makes better use of resources and reduces the environmental impact may apply.

YOUNG PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER AWARD

Awarded annually to a CSCE Member or Associate Member who has demonstrated outstanding accomplishments as a young professional engineer. Normally, nominees must be no older than 35 as of December 31 of the year that the award is presented, although this limit may be extended for nominees who have taken extended leave from professional practice.
